3	Foundation Stage	Apply knowledge and skills in a range of complex activities demonstrating comprehension of relevant theories; access and analyse information independently and make reasoned judgements, selecting from a considerable choice of procedures in familiar and unfamiliar contexts; directly own activities with some responsibility for the output of others.
4	Certificate Level	Develop a rigorous approach to the acquisition of a broad knowledge base; employ a range of specialised skills; evaluate information using it to plan and develop investigative strategies and to determine solutions to a variety of unpredictable problems; operate in a range of varied and specific contexts taking responsibility for the nature and quality of outputs.
5	Diploma Level	Generate ideas through the analysis of concepts at an abstract level with a command of specialised skills and the formulation of responses to well defined and abstract problems; analyse and evaluate information; exercise significant judgement across a broad range of functions; accept responsibility for determining and achieving personal and/or group outcomes.
6	Honour's Level	Critically review, consolidate and extend a systematic and coherent body of knowledge utilising specialised skills across an area of study; critically evaluate new concepts and evidence from a range of sources; transfer and apply diagnostic and creative skills and exercise significant judgement in a range of situations; accept accountability for determining and achieving personal and/or group outcomes.
7	Master's Level	Display mastery of a complex and specialised area of knowledge and skills, employing advanced skills to conduct research or advanced technical or professional activity; accept accountability for related decision making including use of supervision; demonstrate a deep understanding of the subject through independent modes of learning.
8	Doctoral Level	Make a significant and original contribution to a specialised field of inquiry demonstrating command of methodological issues and engaging in critical dialogue with peers; accept full accountability for outcomes.

Below is a guide to calibration based on credits normally earned in a standard full-time year at undergraduate and postgraduate level. Each credit relates to 10 hours notional learning time.

## MARKING SCALE AND AWARD CLASSIFICATION

Modules [level 3 to level 8] are graded using percentages or a pass/fail. Each grade is defined by a descriptor, which reflects the quality of the student performance. Where an Award is present then the tables below show the appropriate Award classification or category. Prior to 2012 the University of Derby alpha grading system was used. Prior to 18/19 table 1 applied to module level 3 to level 8 and both undergraduate and post-graduate Awards. From 18/19 table 1 applies to undergraduate – module level 3 to level 6 only and table 2 applies to postgraduate - module level 7 and level 8.
